THE LITURGY OF THE COMMUNITY OF TAIZÉ 10:30 a.m.

Taizé is a French Protestant monastic community made up of men dedicated to the service of Jesus Christ in the church and world. Its members come from Presbyterian and Lutheran backgrounds, and are natives of Switzerland, France, Holland and Germany. Their center is at Taizé, a small village near Cluny in the French Province of Burgundy. The Brothers of Taizé are committed to holding property in common, to celibacy, and to obedience. One of their most significant occupations is the study of liturgy. Their own eucharistic liturgy, which we are doing this morning, reflects their communal life as they draw about the altar. Taizé was founded during the second World War and their liturgy is a truly contemporary one. In general outline, it follows the ancient Catholic rites in contrast to the Liturgy of South India which follows the Anglican pattern.
